Implementation Status and Key Decisions

The project has supported almost 800,000 direct and indirect beneficiaries by: i) promoting state-citizen trust through the creation of social capital; ii) enhancing access to activities that promote context-specific livelihoods; and, iii) improving access to productive and social infrastructure.

The project has mobilized almost 1,300 community based platforms, which are not only used to promote social cohesion but are also representative bodies at the local level, eligible for receiving and mobilizing development financing from multiple sources.

A total of 320 infrastructure schemes have been completed to date while an additional 47 are under implementation.

A number of key actions have been delayed because key positions including project director, gender and social safeguards, infrastructure specialist and social organisers remain vacant. Implementation is expected to improve once these positions are filled.



The project is extended till December 31, 2019.

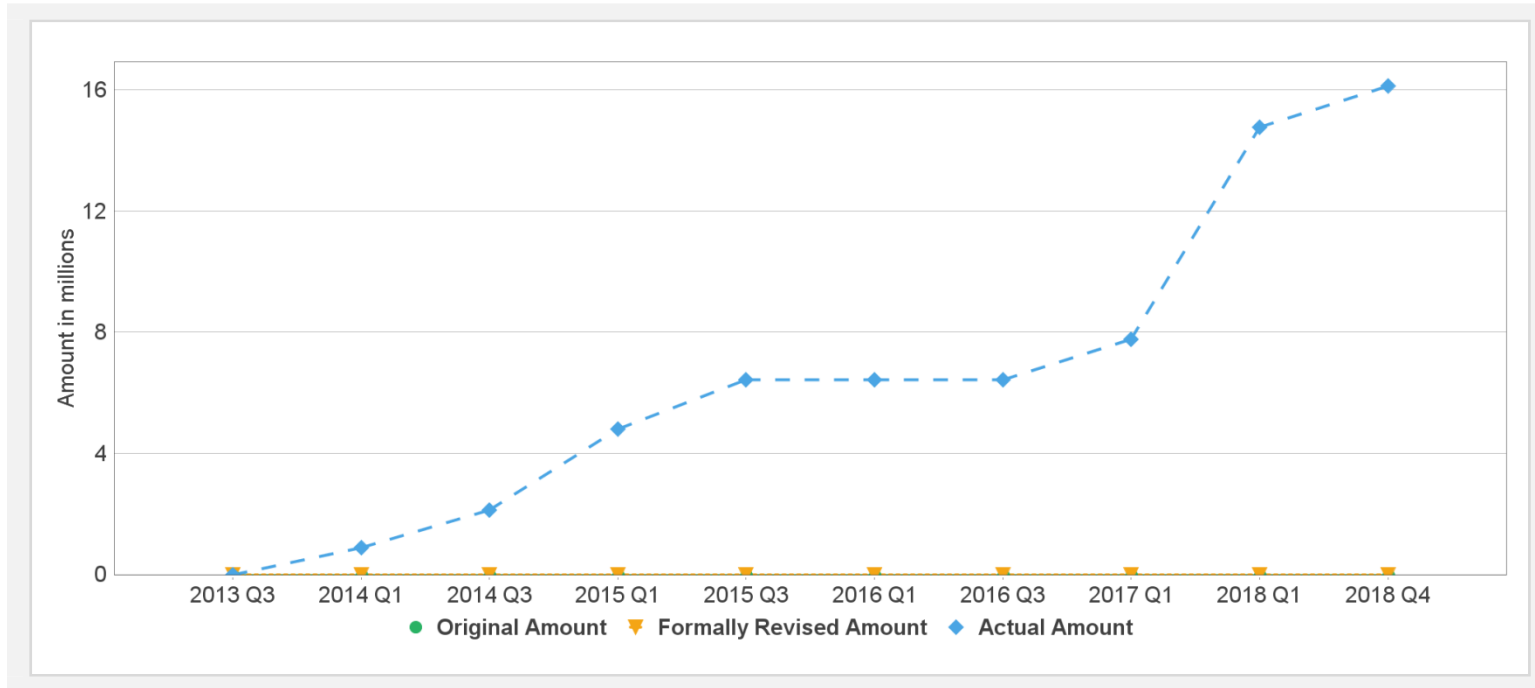
