Implementation Status and Key Decisions

The Additional Financing (AF) of the Economic Revitalization of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa project (ERKP) became effective in March 2017 for an amount of US\$19 million, with a closing date of June 30, 2020. The total number of SME matching grants beneficiaries of the AF is 1094, as of March 2021. More than 13,000 jobs have been created and restored since year 2011 when the original project was launched. The project has also

3/22/2021 Page 1 of 7 provided analytical support and technical assistance to province's tourism sector. ERKP is actively supporting the tourism sector of the province and has already procured road clearing and waste management equipment for the Galliyat Development Authority (GDA). The excavator, garbage compactors, trash cans and tourist carts were handed over to the GDA, Kalam Tehsil and Kaghan Development Authority earlier this year. The project has disbursed fully and its closing date is June 30, 2022.


